

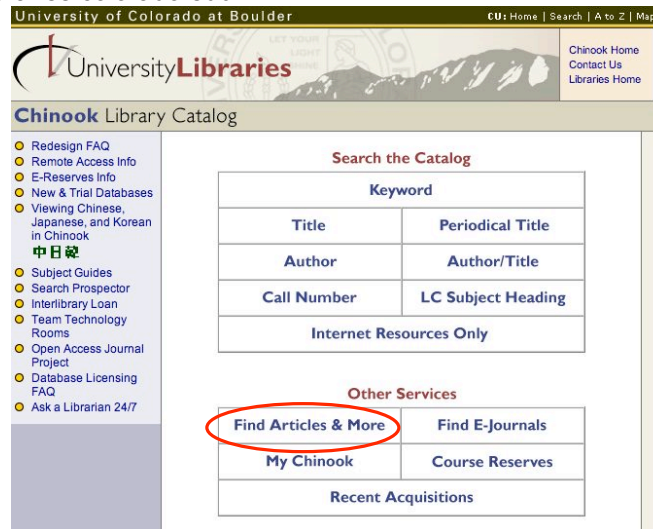

Access to E – reserves

- Log in to the CU Libraries website:

- Click on "Course reserves"
- Search either by Instructor (Jupille) or by course (IAFS1000)
- Select the title you want to visualize
- Enter your IdentiKey User name and Password.

Access to other journals / magazines

Foreign Affairs, Foreign Policy, The National Interest, The Atlantic Monthly, are available on the "InfoTrac OneFile" database (under letter "I" of the databases list). Note that older issues could be inaccessible online; if that is the case, please check on the E-reserves.

The Washington Quarterly is available on 'Ebsco Host' and 'Ingenta' database (respectively under letter "E" and letter "I" of the databases list). Note that older issues could be inaccessible online; if that is the case, please check on the E-reserves.

Older issues of some Academic Journals are available on Jstor (<http://www.jstor.org>).

VPN: Access to the University Library resources from home

To access the University Library resources from home, you need to use Virtual Private Networking (VPN) software to log on to the network first. The software is downloadable for free on the following CU web page:
