- DISSERTATION My dissertation examines the post-passage bargaining process in Congress. I use a non-cooperative bargaining model to find the conditions under which post-passage bargaining occurs, why chambers choose between a conference committee and amendment trading, and why the chambers sometimes fail to reach agreement. Each chamber faces a risk-return tradeoff during the passage and post-passage bargaining stages, and it is this tradeoff which leads to successful reconciliation or failure. Using the model, one can draw inferences about how the chambers learn over time, when conferences will occur, and when the chambers will fail to reach agreement. The results have implications not just for post-passage bargaining, but also for theories of legislative organization, coalition building within Congress, and the effect of partisanship on institutional procedures and outcomes.
